

# Pre-School and After School **Provision**

Early bird activities are available from 8.15 am.

These can be booked on the school cashless system, as required by parents.

'After School Provision' from 2.00 pm - 3.00 pm is offered for pupils in P1 - P3 with siblings in Nursery or P4-P7.

Some additional places are available for pupils who require the provision for pastoral reasons.

It allows pupils to access a range of activities including:

- Outdoor fun and games
- Indoor fun and games
- Art
- Reading
- Curriculum practice

'After School Provision' from 3.00 - 4.00 pm offers pupils in P4 - P7 a wide range of opportunities including:

- **Homework Club**
- **Numeracy Support**
- **Literacy Support**
- **ICT Support**
- Art
- Drama
- Gaelic
- Camogie
- Coding

These are offered in six week blocks at key points throughout the year.







































# Healthy Food Policy

Pupils in Nursery and Foundation Stage (P1 and P2) enjoy healthy snack prepared by School Staff. Peer influence encourages children to try a wide range of foods which are enjoyed in a sociable manner whilst providing pupils with an opportunity to develop self-help skills.

All other pupils
participate in the
Health Trusts 'Boost
Better Breaks'
initiative and bring
their own fruit or
simple bread based
snacks to school.
At key celebrations,
'fruit parties' are
provided for pupils to
reinforce the message
that eating healthily
can also be fun.

Pupils are asked to bring a bottle of water to school each day. This remains on child's desk and ensures that hydration is maintained throughout the day.

### Midday Meal Options

Packed lunch from home. These are eaten in the school dining hall with the child's Classroom Assistant supervising. It is a lovely sociable part of the day which allows staff a chance to monitor lunchbox contents.




We have a wonderful nurturing programme for pupils with emotional needs including

We have a strong programme for digital home school learning. It is based around an app called 'Seesaw'. It allows teachers to upload recordings of pupils at work and play which their parents receive on their own devices. Many parents have commented on how lovely it is to receive a little snippet of their child in action, whilst they, themselves, are in work, at home, out shopping etc.

Our systems enabled us to make a smooth transition to online learning during the recent Covid 19 lockdown.

# Curriculum

The Nursery Curriculum is very much play-based around the following areas:

- Physical Development
- The Arts

Awareness of the World Around Us (WAU)

Foundation Stage and Key Stages 1 and 2 develop learning in age appropriate ways in the following areas:

- Language and Literacy
- Mathematics and Numeracy
- The Arts (Music, Drama and Art)
- The World Around Us (Science, History and Geography)
- Personal Development and Mutual Understanding (Mentioned in the Loving Others Section)
- Physical Development and Movement













































In addition, the Cross Curricular Skills of: Communication, using Mathematics and using ICT are integrated through learning experiences.

Another aspect of the Curriculum is the interwoven 'Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities' of:

- Thinking, problem solving and decision making
- Self management
- Working with others
- Managing information
- Being creative

We are all extremely busy in St Clare's Abbey.

A recent audit undertaken with P7 pupils and their parents showed very clearly that both groups felt that St Clare's Abbey had definitely created pupils who loved God, others and learning.

A key part of your child's learning will be the play-based learning experience.



We aim to help our pupils to 'Love God'. Did we succeed in this for your child? 100% parents replied yes and cited examples of how we have done this

I love the prayerful part of St Clare's Abbey. The sacraments are always so special, the choir is amazing. The May procession is lovely with Mr Byrne playing the guitar and all the children and grown-ups singing. It's a very Holy School.

outdoor activities, learning through nature, using recycled materials to build and create, visits to museums and other informative places"


