Good morning parents,

### 1. Seesaw app and Primary 365 School App.

With reference to Seesaw, I am aware of a lot of activity on each class page, which could lead to some important things being missed by parents. Therefore, I am hoping in future, to send generic information home on the school app Primary 365 eg notices re World Book day, Fair Trade day, school closure, Feis etc. Currently these go home on the Primary 365 school app and Seesaw and the reason is that I am aware that some parents have not been able to access the Primary 365 school app.


This will cease now so **please ensure that you have the Primary 365 school app and if you have difficulties, please contact the school office.**

A second point re Seesaw is- I am aware that parents use this to contact teachers with queries. Whilst this had seemed like a good idea initially, I have realised that many messages are coming in to teachers late into the evening and are being missed because teachers have finished their school work for the day. Also I have had some teachers on sick leave and as such they have not been responding to private Seesaw messages, this is leading to a break-down in communication. Therefore, **I would urge parents to contact school via phone to arrange a chat with a teacher if it is an important query.** I can also be contacted via email [mmonaghan771@c2kni.net](mailto:mmonaghan771@c2kni.net) as I do not regularly access Seesaw messaging and could miss something important. I check my emails constantly. Other than that posts from home to school under the posted work should continue as these are important but if not seen immediately, they will not impact on the child, or teacher/ parent communication channel.

### 2. Sacramental preparation talks for parents.c

Thank you to those P7 parents who registered for the Confirmation preparation talks.
