




Baby Programme

The Incredible Years baby programme is primarily aimed at parents/carers of children aged 0 - 1 year old. It works to strengthen parent-child interaction and attachment.

Parents will be supported to:

- Help their babies feel loved, safe, and secure.
- Encourage their babies' physical and language development.
- Provide physical, tactile and visual stimulation
- The parenting group format fosters peer support networks and shared learning. Trained Incredible Years® facilitators use video clips of real-life situations to support the training and stimulate group discussions. Parents practice skills with their babies in the group.



Sextortion

What is sextortion?

Sextortion is a cyber-enabled crime during which victims are lured into sharing intimate images or performing sexual acts in front of a webcam. Unbeknown to victims, their actions are recorded by criminals who then use the video footage in an attempt to blackmail individuals.

Offenders will commonly target their victims through dating apps, social media or webcams using a false identity.

Anyone can be a victim

Anyone can be a victim but there are steps you can take to prevent this type of crime from happening to you. Prevention advice

- Update the privacy settings on your social networking accounts so only people you know can view your account.
- Do not include any sensitive, private or confidential information in profiles.

- Do not share intimate videos online.
- Do not get lured into compromising situations such as removing clothes or performing intimate acts online.
- Always remember that what goes online may well stay online.
- Be wary about who you invite or accept invitations from on social networking sites. Do not accept friendship requests from complete strangers.

Immunisations Schedule and are urging parents to check their child's red book to see if vaccinations are up-to-date

Vaccination rates have seen a slight decrease over recent years and the additional disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic is likely to have caused some of the decreases in vaccine coverage

It is important vaccination coverage is improved as soon as possible to help prevent the spread of avoidable serious and sometimes deadly diseases such as measles and polio


